General Information

Pastoral Care

Pastoral care is of paramount importance to school life. It reflects our values, beliefs and ethos. We strive to provide a nurturing environment in which every child feels valued and can realise their full potential. Our school staff work collectively to ensure the pastoral needs of the children in our care are fully met. For the benefit of your P1 child, we run a 'Buddy System' where P7 pupils are paired with a P1 child to aid their transition into life in 'big school'.

All policies related to pastoral care are made available to parents when their children start school.

Positive Behaviour and Reward Systems

In Maghera Primary School, we model a positive approach to pupil behaviour, aiming to instil the values of respect and honesty. Each classroom sets a weekly academic or behavioural target, and pupils who demonstrate positive progress in the agreed area are awarded a 'Roll of Honour' certificate at Friday Assembly. Other positive incentives include our House Point System and in-class rewards. Copies of our Positive Behaviour and Discipline policies are available from the School Office.

Child Protection

Safeguarding the children in our care is of paramount importance to all members of staff at Maghera Primary. Appropriate, up-to-date training is provided to all staff and governors in line with Education Authority recommendations. Information relating to our Safeguarding Team is made visible at designated points throughout the school and is regularly highlighted to the children by their class teacher.

Attendance

Our school has always achieved high levels of attendance and co-operates fully with Education Welfare Services in ensuring that all children receive their legal educational entitlement. The register is kept daily, and all absences recorded.

Wrap Around Care

Breakfast Club

Maghera Primary School provides a Breakfast Club which operates each day from 8.10am to 8.50am at a small cost. Children are supervised, and breakfast is provided if desired.

Play and Learn Club

Maghera Primary School provides a Play and Learn Club under the leadership of Mrs McKinley. PAL Club is available to pupils daily from 1:50pm- 4:30pm. The children can complete homework, have supervised indoor and outdoor play, have access to the computer suite and enjoy a healthy snack. Children can be catered for at short notice.

General Uniform

Our school uniform is:

Admission and Enrolment



Admission Criteria

If the school's admission and enrolment numbers have not been reached, the school will admit all children of appropriate age whose parents wish them to attend the school.

In the event of the school being oversubscribed, the Board of Governors has established admissions criteria.

The criteria are listed in order of priority:

1. Children must be of school age.
2. Children with a sibling already in attendance.
3. Children in order of closeness of the home to the school, measured by Google Maps.

Enrolment Procedure

1a. OPEN ENROLMENT

Parents who wish to enrol their child for September can apply online from Tuesday 7th January 2020 at www.eani.org.uk

1b. TRANSFER FROM ANOTHER SCHOOL

Parents should contact the Principal and, if possible, call at the school.

Before a child can be enrolled, a copy of their birth certificate must be provided, will be photocopied and kept on file.

2. STATUTORY AGE FOR PRIMARY 1

Children who have their fourth birthday on or before 1st July 2020 are eligible for P1 in September.

Language and Literacy

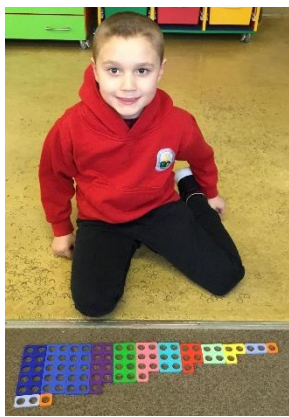
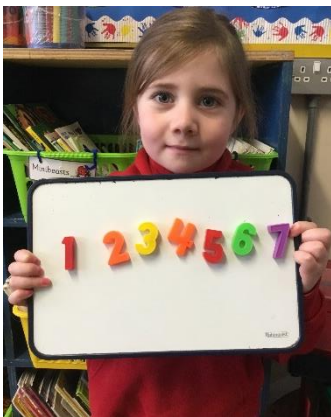

Literacy is embedded in every aspect of learning in Maghera Primary School. We believe it is important for our pupils to develop their literacy skills through a variety of meaningful, real life experiences. Throughout the school children read books appropriate to their level from our comprehensive and ever expanding reading scheme. They are also encouraged to read for enjoyment and participate in the Accelerated Reader Programme in school and at home. Pupils are challenged to develop fluency in written expression through the Jolly Phonics programme and the explicit teaching of spelling rules and strategies. Literacy intervention is also provided twice weekly by our Literacy Support Teacher, Mrs McMullan, for pupils who have specific literacy needs.



Mathematics and Numeracy

In Maghera Primary, we aim to help our pupils become confident mathematicians through a structured and integrated approach to the teaching of Numeracy. Lessons focus on basic number sense, mental maths strategies, problem solving and reasoning. Many practical resources including Numicon and ICT programmes are used to enhance the teaching and learning of mathematics.



ICT

At Maghera Primary School, our pupils are encouraged to use ICT to engage in meaningful research and activities which extend learning across the curriculum. Through the use of ICT our goal is to develop pupils' thinking skills and independence. We have a variety of resources to enhance ICT including: Interactive Whiteboards, iPads, Spheros, GreenScreen Technology, Beebots and an ICT Suite.



Espresso is an online, interactive teaching and learning facility used by the teachers and children in school. It can be accessed through our school website portal and is a useful tool to aid with home learning. It has proved extremely popular and beneficial.

P3-7 pupils have access to **Accelerated Reader** in school and at home. This programme encourages reading for enjoyment, giving them instant feedback on their comprehension of the text and the level of books they can read independently.

World Around Us



We cover a wide variety of topics throughout our school such as, Houses and Homes, Space, Celebrations, Vikings, Our Locality, All About Me, Chocolate and Egyptians amongst others. These are planned with the children and use the school resources and local amenities effectively.

- Provide new experiences and set new challenges.

We offer a broad and balanced programme which includes professional coaching from Community Sports Network, Mid Ulster Council and Tobermore Football Club.



Religious Education

At Maghera Primary School we aim to model and encourage our school values of honesty, respect and self-discipline.

Whole school assemblies are conducted twice weekly and reflect our Christian ethos. Local ministers and other speakers participate in weekly assemblies, and during the year there are Special Assemblies and Festivals to which parents and carers are encouraged to attend.

As a school we support many charities throughout the year including, Save the Children, Royal British Legion, Marie Curie Cancer Care and RAF Wings Appeal. In addition to this giving, we also sponsor two Peruvian children through Compassion Ministries. This financial support enables these children to attend school, eat nutritious food and have medical check-ups.



Shared Education

Maghera Primary School's Shared Education Programme offers staff and pupils an invaluable opportunity for meaningful engagement with our partner school, St. Mary's Primary School. Working collaboratively, topical lessons with clear curricular links are planned and delivered to all of our pupils at different times, inside and outside the two school premises. This is our fourth year working with St Mary's and it is pleasing to see new friendships formed within this forum. Parental involvement is essential. We have been delighted to co-host an awareness morning on the subject of climate change in the local Community Centre with P6/7 pupils. Representatives from our local and district councils, churches, governors, parents and friends joined with us. Other examples of working to bring our communities together include an introductory workshop for parents on the use of Numicon with Foundation Stage pupils and a P6 presentation on reducing plastic use to local business representatives.



Special Educational Needs

At Maghera Primary School, we recognise that children progress as individuals and at differing rates. We work collectively as a staff to support each child as they reach their full potential. We aim to provide an inclusive and nurturing environment in which our pupils feel comfortable and confident. We provide differentiated support as needed and work with external agencies to meet the needs of every child in our care.

Assessment

The assessment of children's progress is an integral part of the learning and teaching process. It contributes to a view of the child's personal, social, physical and intellectual achievements.

Music and Drama

We offer a variety of performance opportunities throughout the school year including, Harvest, Easter and Leavers' Assemblies, a Foundation Stage/Key Stage 1 Christmas performance and a Key Stage 2 Christmas performance.

Our P4-P7 choir are given the opportunity to participate in performances inside and outside of school. Children are encouraged to avail of in-school music tuition from specialist tutors in violin, pipes and drums.



French Tuition

Fun and interactive French language and culture lessons are delivered to each class on a weekly basis by our French teacher, Miss Fry. Pupils have opportunities to learn songs in French throughout the year.

School & Eco Council

Pupils are encouraged to make a positive contribution to all aspects of school life. Staff seek the views and opinions of the pupils and involve them in school decision making. In choosing our School and Eco Councils, we model fair election procedures. Each pupil from Primary 4-7 presents a short speech to their peers, who then vote for their chosen class representatives.

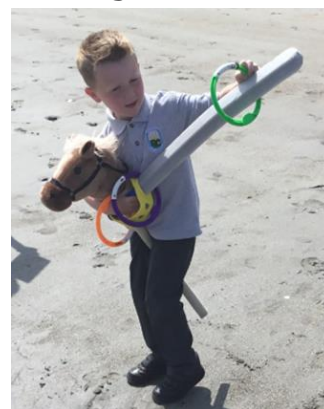


Pupil learning is enhanced through several educational visits throughout the school year. Examples of the places visited include:
